Ellis Island is located next to Liberty Island. You can visit Ellis Island by boat.

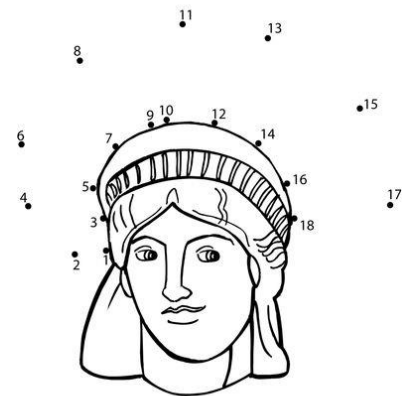

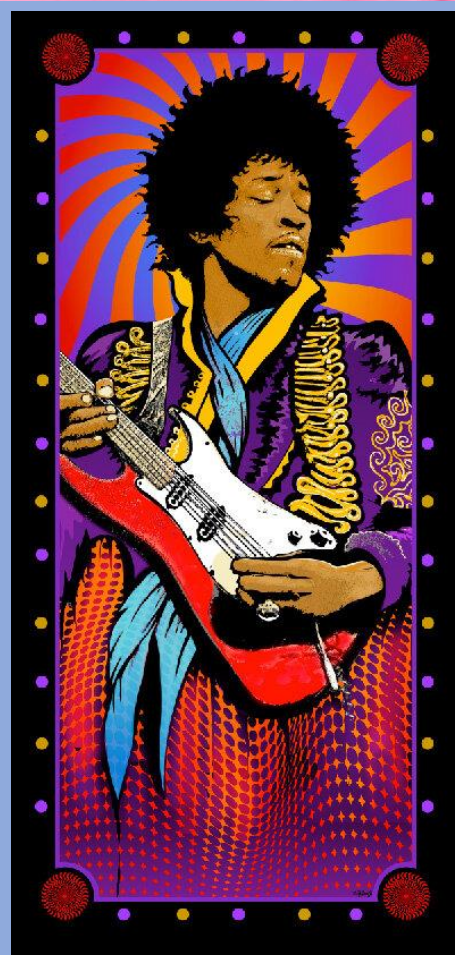
