Xavier is albino. He lives in Rwanda. Because of his disease, he has white skin (it is very strange in Africa), eye and skin problems so he always wears sunglasses. His Mum is worried because she doesn't want her son to be bullied at school. Moreover, she is scared because her son may be kidnapped by witch doctors. At home, he can't do his homework because he hasn't got electricity. He is really clever. He is a kind boy who wants to become a doctor to help people



Charles lives in Kenya and he is blind (his father has eye problems too). He has very short hair and white eyes. He often wears sunglasses to hide his eyes and to protect them from the sun. He runs every day with a person who helps him (he is tied to her wrist) to become a champion at the paralympics. In the film, he meets a famous paralympics running champion and thanks to him, he can go to a normal school.

Her name is Maud and she lives in France in Bagnolet. She has an artificial leg because when she was a baby, she had a problem and the doctors cut her leg. She can't hear so she is deaf and she wears hearing aid. With her artificial leg, she can dance but she is not able to run. She has got a twin sister called Romy and her family is really nice. She would like to become a lawyer.



Antonio lives in Brazil and he is autistic. He is eight years old and he was adopted. He is disabled but he can do sports; for example, he can run everywhere. He is unable to keep focused for a long time so he goes to a special school. His parents want him to learn things. Antonio has lovely parents: his father is disabled too because of a car accident but with his wife, they are tango dancing champions. Antonio's dream is to become a fireman.





Khendo and Nirmala live in Kathmandu, Nepal and they are 14 years old. They have only one leg because there was an earthquake in their country in 2015. Nirmala's dream is to become a professional singer or dancer. Unlike Nirmala, Khendo would like to become a nurse.

We have a dream that one day they will not be criticized or be judged by their disability but by their ability and creativity.
